The public's awareness of the significance and breadth of head and neck surgery is growing as It is more crucial than ever to raise awareness of specialised surgical care because head and neck malignancies account for a large percentage of cancer cases, which rank as Malaysia's fourth most common cause of death.

Otorhinolaryngology, Head and Neck Surgery (ORL-HNS) is a specialized medical field that focuses on the diagnosis, treatment, and management of disorders affecting the ear, nose, throat, head, and neck regions. These surgeons, often referred to as ENT (Ear, Nose, and Throat) surgeons, undergo extensive training to handle both benign and malignant conditions in these anatomically complex areas.

The breadth of ORL-HNS surgery is much broader than most people first think. Although they are frequently linked to standard treatments like tonsillectomies or sinus infection treatment, these specialists also carry out extremely difficult cancer surgeries, reconstructive procedures, and potentially lifesaving microsurgical techniques.





THE CURRENT LANDSCAPE IN MALAYSIA

Malaysia faces a significant burden when it comes to head and neck diseases. According to recent data, cancer has become increasingly prevalent in the country.

CANCER-RELATED DEATHS RISING FROM 10.5% IN 2021 TO 12.6% IN 2022.

Within this context, head and neck cancers represent a substantial portion of the cancer burden. The epidemiology of cancer in Malaysia is showing concerning tendencies, according to recent statistics. Latestage cancer detection has risen to 65%, according to the Malaysia National Cancer Registry Report 2017–2021, meaning that many individuals receive their diagnoses after their illnesses are more advanced and difficult to treat. The significance of early diagnosis and the expertise of ORL-HNS surgeons in handling these complicated cases are highlighted by this statistic.

HEAD AND NECK CANCER STATISTICS IN MALAYSIA

Head and neck cancers pose a significant health burden in Malaysia, with over 1,500 new cases diagnosed annually. These cancers rank as the third most common among men and fourth among women. Nasopharyngeal carcinoma (NPC) is the most prevalent type, especially among Asian populations, and shows gender disparities in incidence rates. Alarmingly, 65% of cancers are detected at late stages, complicating treatment and reducing survival rates. The Malaysia National Cancer Registry highlights regional and demographic variations, emphasizing the need for targeted awareness and early detection strategies to combat the rising trend of head and neck cancers nationwide.
